THE STAGES OF ESSAY WRITING

STAGE	THINGS TO DO
THROUGHOUT THE ESSAY PLANNING AND WRITING PROCESS OUTLINED BELOW	Plan and organise your essay, checking what you are doing all the time. Stand back, think about and evaluate where you are up to in the essay writing process, asking yourself questions such as: Have I enough information on each section? Am I still on track towards answering the question? Have I gone off at a tangent anywhere?
PICK THE ESSAY TITLE TO BITS Information sheets: Essay title analysing "Do" words in essay titles "Do" words in essay titles	Read the title carefully, several times. Underline the key words and phrases. Break the title down into its elements, making sure you don't miss any out. Identify all the "do" words and define them.
2. CREATE A ROUGH PLAN OF THE MIDDLE SECTION OF YOUR ESSAY Information sheet: Essay title analysing	Using your workings from Stage 1, create a rough, basic plan of the middle section of your essay, in whichever format you prefer.
3. GATHER THE INFORMATION YOU NEED FOR YOUR ESSAY Information sheets: Sources of information Evaluating sources of information	Using your rough plan to maintain your focus, gather and evaluate the information you need to answer the essay question.
4. READ AND TAKE NOTES FROM THE INFORMATION YOU HAVE GATHERED Related topics: Reading and notetaking [link] Critical thinking and analysis [link]	Carefully read the books and other sources of information you have gathered, making notes on them as you go along.

5. CREATE A DETAILED PLAN OF THE MIDDLE SECTION OF YOUR ESSAY Information sheet: Essay structure	Using the reading you have done, create a plan of the middle section of your essay which is much more detailed than your original rough plan. Include in your plan, your main sections and arguments, in the order in which you will present them.
6. WRITE A DRAFT OF YOUR ESSAY Information sheets: Essay structure Editing the draft of your essay Related topics: Critical thinking and analysis [link] Effective writing [link]	Write the middle section of your essay first, using the detailed plan you have just created. When you are satisfied with your middle section, write the introduction to and the conclusion of your essay. Edit your draft as you go along.
7. CREATE YOUR LIST OF REFERENCES Related topic: Referencing and avoiding plagiarism [link]	Reference the sources of information you have drawn on for your essay, according to your department's referencing guidelines.
8. PROOFREAD THE FINAL DRAFT OF YOUR ESSAY Information sheet: Proofreading the final draft of your essay	Once you are happy with your essay, proof read it carefully, several times. Also ask someone else to proofread it – you are often too close to your work to spot your own mistakes!
